



NAVY OPEN RESULTS

TEMPLE UNIVERSITY

Temple competed to a first place finish at the Navy Open, held Saturday (Jan. 23) in Annapolis, Md. The Owls, led by two first place finishes from senior Patrick McLaughlin, scored a team total of 332.500 en route to winning the meet.

The reigning ECAC Men's Gymnast of the Week, McLaughlin scored 14.650 on parallel bars, and 14.900 on high bar, both earning him first place. The senior also placed second on floor (14.350) and third on pommel horse (13.400).

Also taking a first place finish was senior Scott Bloomfield, who scored a 15.600 on vault. Junior Blake Collins took the title on rings (14.650) and finished third all-around (84.050).

Two freshmen fared well for the Owls, with Allan Mallone placing third on high bar (14.200) and Assaf Zoor finishing second on rings (14.400).

SPRINGFIELD COLLEGE

Springfield College continues to fashion a fine season in the early going, as they finished

second in the Navy Open in a 6-way meet. Springfield scored 331.600 points, placing second only to Temple at 332.200.

The team scores were as follows: Temple 332.200, Springfield 331.600, William & Mary 323.700, Navy 317.000, Capital 289.500, and Brockport 274.350.

Among individuals, both co-captain Matt Tocchio and Jimmy Pezzino produced victories on a pair of apparatus. Tocchio captured the pommel horse with a score of 14.000. Pezzino, a freshman from Buffalo, N.Y., picked up a win on floor exercise with a tally of 14.500.

Pezzino also placed second on vault with a score of 15.550, while Tocchio also placed sixth in the floor exercise (13.950).

Other members of the Pride also placed in the top eight in further events. Senior co-captain Kyle Bartgis had a homecoming of sorts by placing second on parallel bars with a score of 14.000. Sophomore Ty Evans had a great day, placing third in the parallel bars (13.800), tying for third in the high bar (14.200), tying for fourth in the vault (15.40), placing sixth in the still rings (14.050), and placing seventh in the pommel horse (13.000).

Junior Josh Fox also had a homecoming of sorts, placing in a tie for third in the floor exercise (14.100), and tying for sixth in the high bar (14.100). And junior Michael Licari

tyed for fourth in the pommel horse at 13.350.

Overall, in the all-around, Evans placed second at 84.150, while Fox placed fourth at 81.500.

WILLIAM AND MARY

The College of William and Mary opened up its 2010 schedule this afternoon at the Navy Open, posting a team score of 323.7, finishing third in the five-team field at the United States Naval Academy.

The event marked the start of Tribe Head Coach Cliff Gauthier's 37th season at the helm of the College's program. His team comes into the year having made five appearances at the NCAA Championships since 2002 and the challenge for this season's youth-dominated squad will be steady development every time out.

Saturday, despite being challenged to field a full six-performer line-up on each event due to injuries, senior co-captain Derek Gyax led the strong effort by posting a good early season all-around score of 81.25. The six-event total ranked him fifth overall at the event. His best individual finish came on the parallel bars, where he tied for third overall with a mark of 14.20. Gyax also placed in the top five on the parallel bars, where he posted a score of 13.55, which was good for fifth place.

The team's second-highest individual scorer was junior transfer student Dave Ellis,

who was making his debut in the College's line-up. Ellis put together a five-event total of 67.250, with all five of his marks counting towards the team score. His best individual finish was on the vault, which saw him place third with a mark of 15.450.

Sophomore Jonathan Prohov had the team's top individual finish at the meet, placing second on the pommel with a mark of 13.55. Senior Josh Fried started his year off on a solid note, by placing third on the floor exercise, with a mark of 14.10. Freshman Vince Smurro also gave a good accounting of himself, as he cracked the top seven in both the floor exercise (13.900, sixth-place) and pommel horse (12.850, seventh). Fellow freshman Kris Yeager rounded out the Tribe performers in the top seven, as he finished sixth on the parallel bar with a score of 13.50.

UNITED STATE NAVAL ACADEMY

Highlighted by Andrew Faulk's first-place performance in the all-around, the Navy gymnastics team placed fourth in the Navy Open on Saturday afternoon in Macdonough Hall.

Temple won the meet with a score of 332.5 points to edge second-place Springfield's 331.6 points. William & Mary tallied 323.7 points, followed by Navy's 317.0 points and SUNY Brockport's (club) 274.35 points.

Faulk led Navy and finished among the top-

six overall gymnasts in each of the six disciplines to total 84.8 points in the all-around, 0.65-point ahead of second-place gymnast Ty Evans from Springfield. Faulk's cumulative score on Saturday was 2.45 points higher than his showing at the West Point Open just a week before.

The Navy sophomore registered a 14.35-point performance on the high bar to land in second place, 0.55-point off first-place performer Patrick McLaughlin from Temple. Faulk placed third on the still rings (14.2 points), fourth on the floor exercise (14.0 points), fourth on the pommel horse (13.35 points), fourth on the vault (15.4 points) and sixth on the parallel bars (13.5 points).

Rookie Austin Zalik placed ninth in the all-around with a 77.65-point showing, highlighted by his ninth-place score of 13.7 points on the still rings. Team captain Brian Quinn finished sixth on the still rings with a 14.0-point routine.

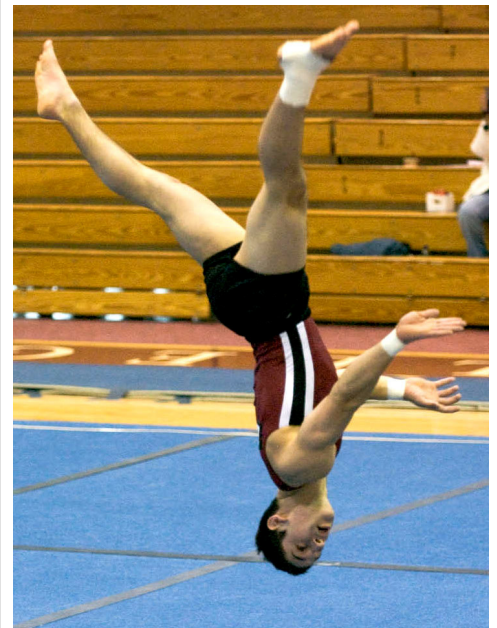
