



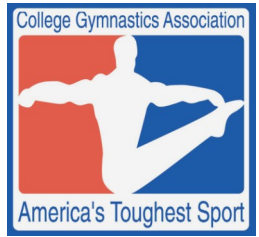

UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN

No. 3-ranked University of Michigan picked up a pair of team victories on Saturday (March 23) on Senior Night in Cliff Keen Arena. U-M (440.750) defeated No. 15 UIC (404.000) and SUNY-Brockport (306.550). Junior Matt Freeman won both still rings and pommel horse, while classmate Sam Mikulak won vault and high bar.

PENN STATE UNIVERSITY

Head coach Randy Jepson and the Penn State men's gymnastics program have had their fair share of success in his 22 seasons at the helm, but with a 433.650-427.800 victory at No. 7 Minnesota on Saturday evening the top-ranked Nittany Lions collected just the second undefeated season during his tenure in Happy Valley.

The victory sealed the 19th undefeated reg-

ular season in school history and pushed the Nittany Lions to 13-0 heading into the Big Ten Championships in Minneapolis. It's their first unblemished regular season since 2003 and just their fourth such occurrence in the last 40 years.

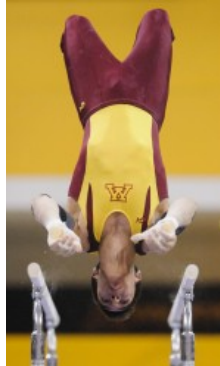

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

The University of Minnesota concluded the regular season with a 433.650-428.00 loss to No. 1 Penn State on Saturday night at the Sports Pavilion. The No. 7 Gophers return to action when they host the Big Ten Championships on April 5-6.

The Gophers opened the meet with a 73.300 on the floor exercise, which was their best score on the event since collegiate gymnastics switched to the new scoring format in March.

Sixth-ranked Illinois wrapped up the regular season with a 425.400-424.250 loss to No. 11 Nebraska Saturday evening at Huff Hall. Four Illinois gymnasts came away with titles, including fifth-year senior Austin Phillips, who notched his first title of the season with his first win on high bar since 2011. The Cornhuskers edged the Illini on four of six events, and the Orange and Blue posted a season-low team total after leading through five rotations in the 1.15-point loss on Senior Day.

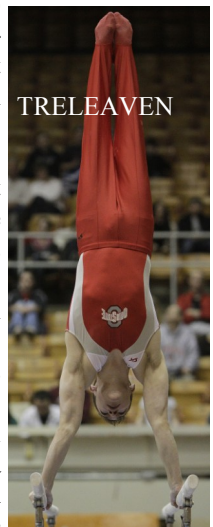

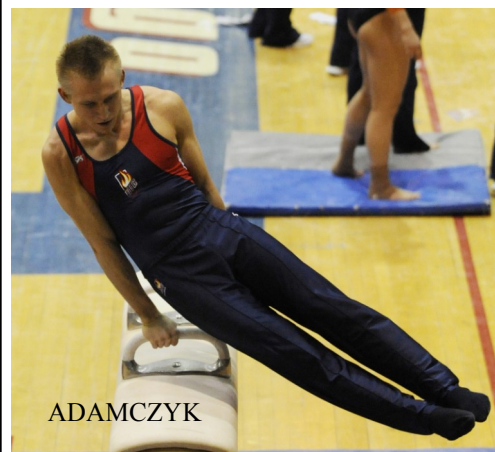

U. S. MILITARY ACADEMY

Army senior Garrek Hojan-Clark, a finalist for the Nissen-Emery Award, earned medalist honors on pommel horse for the eighth time this season, but his performance and that of Kip Webber, who was runner-up in three events, wasn't enough as the Black Knights fell short in a triangular hosted by Temple.
