Note: Following the IOC's announcement that the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games have been rescheduled to take place July 23 – August 8, 2021, it was confirmed that these Games would still be referred to as the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020. Therefore, any references to the Olympic qualification system, Olympic Team, Olympic Trials and/or Olympic Games still reflect '2020' in these selection procedures.

## **1. SELECTION SYSTEM**

1.1. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for selection to the Team:

1.1.1. Nationality/Passport requirements:

Athlete must be a national of the United States at the start of the Tryout Events (see 1.2.1.).

Athlete must hold a valid U.S. passport that will not expire for six (6) months after the conclusion of the Games.

1.1.2. Minimum International Olympic Committee (IOC) standards for participation:

Any competitor in the Olympic Games must be a national of the country of the National Olympic Committee (NOC) which is entering such competitor. For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the Olympic Charter (Rule 41), the IPC Handbook (Section 2, Chapter 3.1), or the PASO Statutes (Article XXII, Sections 4 and 5).

1.1.3. Minimum International Gymnastics Federation (FIG) standards for participation (if any):

- Athlete must be a minimum of 18 years of age by December 31, 2021 (born on or before December 31, 2003).
- Hold a valid FIG Athlete License through the end of the 2020 Olympic Games Trampoline Gymnastics competitions.

- Have reached the minimum technical standard established by the FIG and available at [www.fig-gymnastics.com](http://www.fig-gymnastics.com).

1.1.4. Other requirements (if any):

- Athletes must have successfully completed all Games Registration requirements by stated deadline.
- Athlete must be a member in good standing with USA Gymnastics at the time of nomination.
- Athlete must meet the Senior Elite mobility requirements to compete as a Senior Elite athlete. Mobility requirements are posted in the 2020-2021 [Trampoline & Tumbling Rules & Policies](#) (Sec. VI) (due to be published by September 2020).
- Any athlete age 18 or older will be required to undergo a background screen in accordance with the current USOPC Background Check Policy.
- Any athlete age 18 or older as of the Olympic Games Closing Ceremony will be required to complete the U.S. Center for SafeSport's online training.

1.2. Tryout Events:

- 1.2.1. Provide the event names, dates and locations of all trials, events and camps to be used as part of the selection process.

Additional information regarding the final competition dates, competition schedule and the competition format will be published via the T&T (Trampoline & Tumbling) page of the USA Gymnastics website at [https://usagym.org/pages/tt/events/program\\_events.html](https://usagym.org/pages/tt/events/program_events.html) a minimum of 45 days prior to the start of each of the Tryout Events listed below.

Due to the ongoing pandemic, recent changes made to the FIG Qualification system, and schedule conflicts between the recently confirmed dates for remaining opportunities for the U.S. to qualify Olympic quotas (World Cup and Continental Qualifier) and domestic Tryout Events, the Tryout Events are now as follows:

Tryout Event 1:

- 2021 Elite Challenge – May 13-16, 2021, Birmingham, AL

Tryout Event 2:

- 2021 VIP Classic – June 3-6, 2021, Marion, OH  
OR
  - 2021 Brescia World Cup – June 4-5, 2021, Brescia, ITA \*
- \* Scores may only be used from the 2021 Brescia World Cup if the athlete is eligible as described in 1.2.2.

Tryout Event 3:

- 2021 USA Gymnastics Championships – June 22-27, 2021, St. Louis, MO OR
- 2021 Pan American Championships, June 11-13, 2021, Rio de Janeiro, BRA \*\*  
\*\* Scores may only be used from the 2021 Pan American Championships if the athlete is eligible as described in 1.2.2. and is unable to compete at the 2021 USA Gymnastics Championships due to complications arising from competing internationally (for example, quarantine restrictions or testing positive for COVID).

1.2.2. Provide event names, dates, locations and description of how athletes qualify for the trials, events and camps listed above in 1.2.1. (if any).

- To qualify to compete at the 2021 VIP Classic and 2021 Elite Challenge, athletes must meet mobility requirements as a Senior Elite as stated in the 2020-2021 Trampoline & Tumbling Rules & Policies (Sec. VI).
- To compete at the 2021 USA Gymnastics Championships, athletes must meet qualification requirements as stated in the 2020-2021 Trampoline & Tumbling Rules & Policies (Sec. VI).
- The process for selecting athletes to participate in World Cups and continental championships is described in the [2021 T&T International Assignments & Selections document](#), however, to be eligible to use scores from the 2021 Brescia World Cup and/or 2021 Pan American Championships as part of the process for selection to the Olympic Team as outlined in 1.3.3., an athlete must be mathematically able to secure the USA a quota place to the Olympic Games, based on the current FIG qualification procedures, points earned to-date and remaining opportunities, defined as:
  - Brescia World Cup: any athlete with world ranking points prior to Brescia World Cup per the FIG World Rankings list found at [www.gymnastics.sport/site/rankings/ranking\\_tra.php](http://www.gymnastics.sport/site/rankings/ranking_tra.php).
  - Pan American Championships: Senior Men (due to having no current continental representation within the allocated quota places – see official [Olympic Games Qualification System](#)).If an athlete does not meet this criteria and chooses to participate in the 2021 Brescia World Cup and/or 2021 Pan American Championships, he or she will forego the opportunity to earn a score through Tryout Event 2, and if unable to also compete at 2021 USA Gymnastics Championships, through Tryout Event 3.

1.3. Provide a comprehensive, step-by-step description of the method that explains how athletes will go through the selection process (include maximum Team size).

- 1.3.1. The U.S. can qualify up to two (2) males and two (2) females in the discipline of Individual Trampoline to compete at the 2020 Olympic Games as defined in the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG) document *Qualification System – Games of the XXXII Olympiad – Tokyo 2020 (“FIG Qualification Document”)* which can be found at:

Provided the U.S. earns its quota place(s) at the qualification events, USAG will fill all quota places. In addition, up to two replacement athletes in each gender will be named.

1.3.2. Definitions:

- Combined Score: The Combined Score is the sum of the highest two (2) Preliminary Scores from the three Tryout Events listed in 1.2.1.
- Preliminary Score: The Preliminary Score is the sum of Routine 1 and Routine 2 from the preliminary round at a single Tryout Event.

1.3.3. Process for selection:

Depending on the number of Federation quota place(s) earned by the U.S.:

- a. The male athlete and female athlete with the highest Combined Score will be named to the 2020 Olympic Team.
- b. The male athlete and female athlete with the second highest Combined Score will be named to the 2020 Olympic Team (if two Federation quota places are earned per gender), or the replacement athlete (if one Federation quota place is earned).
- c. The male athlete and female athlete with the next highest Combined Score will be the replacement athlete(s) to the 2020 Olympic Team (if two Federation quota places are earned per gender), or may be named as the second replacement athlete.
- d. Any quota place earned by name by an individual athlete will be filled by that athlete.

1.4. Petition Procedures:

Notwithstanding the process identified in the preceding sections of these Selection Procedures, USA Gymnastics recognizes that extraordinary and unforeseen circumstances may occur which would cause an athlete otherwise deserving of a spot on the 2020 Olympic Team because of their previous competition results to be unable to participate in one or more steps in that process.

- Procedures for petitioning into the 2021 Elite Challenge, 2021 VIP Classic and 2021 USA Gymnastics Championships will be published in the 2020-2021 Trampoline & Tumbling Rules & Policies (Section VI).
- Athletes may not petition directly onto the 2020 Olympic Team.

## 2. DISCRETIONARY SELECTION

### 2.1. Provide rationale for utilizing discretionary selection (if any):

While Trampoline & Tumbling is a subjectively judged event, these procedures will primarily rely on objective criteria for selecting athletes to the 2020 Olympic Team through rankings and results at the Tryout Events listed in 1.2.1. However, there are two scenarios where discretionary selection criteria will be evaluated and those are through the petition process and in the unlikely case of a tie.

### 2.2. List the discretionary criteria and explain how they will be used (if any):

#### 2.2.1. Discretionary criteria may be used in two (2) scenarios:

- Breaking a tie in Combined Score (defined in 1.3.2) during any of the steps outlined in 1.3.3.; and
- Reviewing and making a decision on any submitted petitions (refer to 1.4.).

#### 2.2.2. Criteria used by the Selection Committee (SC) will include:

- 2019-2021 international performance and experience, including result, type, frequency, and caliber of the event(s) held in 2019-2021, to which USA Gymnastics assigned athletes (these events can be found on the 2019, 2020 and 2021 T&T calendars).
- 2019-2021 domestic performance and experience, including result, type, frequency, and caliber of the event(s) to be considered, which include the 2019/2020/2021 VIP Classic, 2019/2021 Elite Challenge and 2019/2021 USA Gymnastics Championships.
- Total score potential: prior qualification total score or final pass score.
- Any physical, training or performance factor, which might inhibit peak performance at the 2020 Olympic Games.

### 2.3. Provide the name of the committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections, along with a complete list of the members' titles currently serving on the committee:

The Selection Committee (SC) is a five-member voting body:

- Elite Committee Chair (voice, no vote)\*
- Elite Committee Trampoline Representative
- National Trampoline Coordinator
- Athlete Selection Representative 1
- Athlete Selection Representative 2
- Program Director (process voice, no vote)

\* The Elite Committee Chair will serve as the SC Chair.

Note: An Independent Observer of Procedure appointed by a sub-committee of the USA Gymnastics Board of Directors will be present at the final selection meeting (no voice, no vote).

2.3.1. Specify the process that will be used to identify and handle any potential conflicts of interest involving a member of the committee.

In the event that a SC member is currently affiliated with any athlete or coach in consideration for a Team, or is unable to fulfill the obligations of the SC for any reason, a replacement will be named in the following order:

- Should the Athlete Representative need to be replaced, another person eligible to represent the athletes will be named.
- Should the National Trampoline Coordinator need to be replaced, the Junior National Trampoline Coordinator will be named.
- Should any other member of the SC need to be replaced (including the Junior National Trampoline Coordinator) replacements will be named in the following order:
  - Elite Committee Chair
  - Chair of the Program Committee
  - Members of the SC for other T&T disciplines.
  - International experts (athlete / coach / judge with world-level competition or judging experience).
- Should the National Trampoline Coordinator be replaced due to a conflict of interest, he or she will retain the right to present a selection recommendation (complete with reasoning), and answer questions from the SC, after which time they will be required to leave the selection meeting.

### **3. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES**

3.1. Prior to entry by name to the Local Organizing Committee by the USOPC, USA Gymnastics has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is to be nominated to the Team by USA Gymnastics may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Gymnastics:

3.1.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to USA Gymnastics President/CEO.

- 3.1.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Gymnastics. If an athlete refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Gymnastics, his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
- 3.1.3. Failure to participate in Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in Section 9 of these procedures.
- 3.1.4. Violation of USA Gymnastics Code of Ethical Conduct, National Team Agreement, or Trampoline & Tumbling Responsibility Manual, which may be found online at:

- 3.1.5. Inability to prove competition readiness (see Section 9 below).

An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per USA Gymnastics Bylaws, Article 10 and the USOPC's Bylaws, Section 9.

- 3.2. Once athlete entries have been submitted to the Local Organizing Committee by the USOPC, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team, at which time, in addition to any applicable USA Gymnastics Code of Conduct, the USOPC's Code of Conduct and Grievance Procedures apply. - 3.3. An athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IOC, PASO, WADA, FIG, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, as well as the Policies and Procedures of the U.S. Center for SafeSport, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and USAG's SafeSport policies, as applicable.

#### **4. REPLACEMENT OF ATHLETES**

- 4.1. Describe the selection and approval process for determining replacement athlete(s) should a vacancy occur:
  - 4.1.1. Prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

Provided the FIG allocated the quota by country (as opposed to allocating it to the athlete by name), the replacement athlete in the gender where the vacancy occurred will fill the vacancy and a new replacement will be named per 1.3.
  - 4.1.2. After submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

The same process outlined in Section 4.1.1. will be used provided USA Gymnastics is still authorized to add a replacement athlete to the Team in accordance with the FIG Qualification System, and any applicable IOC and/or LOC rules.

## **5. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS**

A 2020 Olympic Games Athlete Selection Committee Report, outlining the work and decisions of the SC, will be made available for distribution to all athletes and coaches who participated in the selection events within a reasonable amount of time after the conclusion of the 2021 USA Gymnastics Championships. The report will be made public on the USA Gymnastics website. USA Gymnastics retains the sole discretion to determine the contents and timing of the report.

USA Gymnastics will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents, including scouting or evaluation forms, etc., and data from the selection process for six (6) months past the date of the Closing Ceremony of the Games.

## **6. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS**

## **7. PUBLICITY/DISTRIBUTION OF PROCEDURES**

The USOPC approved Selection Procedures (complete and unaltered) will be posted/published by USA Gymnastics in the following locations:

These procedures will be posted as soon as possible, but not more than five (5) business days following notice of approval by the USOPC.

- 7.2. Other: Direct email distribution to age-eligible national team members and their personal coaches.

## **8. DATE OF NOMINATION**

The Nomination of Athletes form, including replacements, will be announced to all athletes and submitted to the USOPC on or before:

June 28, 2021



**9. MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION**

Specify the location, schedule and duration of mandatory training and/or competition:

There are no plans to hold a mandatory training camp for the Olympic Team at this time. Should this change, athletes will be given at least 30 days’ notice by announcement through email to athletes and coaches, as well as posted online.

All athletes, including replacement athletes selected for the 2020 Olympic Games may be required to show complete routines, if requested, at a time, occasion and method decided upon by the T&T Program Director, via either live video or an in-person verification between USA Gymnastics Championships and July 1, 2021. These videos will be assessed by the National Trampoline Coach and an FIG Brevet judge. Failure to show complete routines (both compulsory and optional) may result in removal from the team (see 3.1.5.).

**10. ANTI-DOPING REQUIREMENTS**

Athletes must adhere to all IOC, PASO, WADA, FIG, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing as required by the IOC, PASO, WADA, FIG, USADA and USOPC Rules, as applicable.

If any force of nature, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures will be revised, pursuant to their resubmission to the USOPC.




- To qualify to compete at the 2021 VIP Classic ~~2020 Domestic Selection Event~~ and 2021 ~~2020~~ Elite Challenge, athletes must meet mobility requirements as a Senior Elite as stated in the 2020-2021 ~~2019-2020~~ Trampoline & Tumbling Rules & Policies (Sec. VI).
- To compete at the 2021 ~~2020~~ USA Gymnastics Championships, athletes must meet qualification requirements as stated in the 2020-2021 ~~2019-2020~~ Trampoline & Tumbling Rules & Policies (Sec. VI).
- The process for selecting athletes to participate in World Cups and continental championships is described in the 2021 T&T International Assignments & Selections document, however, to be eligible to use scores from the 2021 Brescia World Cup and/or 2021 Pan American Championships as part of the process for selection to the Olympic Team as outlined in 1.3.3., an athlete must be mathematically able to secure the USA a quota place to the Olympic Games, based on the current FIG qualification procedures, points earned to-date and remaining opportunities, defined as:
  - Brescia World Cup: any athlete with world ranking points prior to Brescia World Cup per the FIG World Rankings list found at [www.gymnastics.sport/site/rankings/ranking\\_tra.php](http://www.gymnastics.sport/site/rankings/ranking_tra.php).

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If an athlete does not meet this criteria and chooses to participate in the 2021 Brescia World Cup and/or 2021 Pan American Championships, he or she will forego the opportunity to earn a score through Tryout Event 2, and if unable to also compete at 2021 USA Gymnastics Championships, through Tryout Event 3.

1.3. Provide a comprehensive, step-by-step description of the method that explains how athletes will go through the selection process (include maximum Team size).

- 1.3.1. The U.S. can qualify up to two (2) males and two (2) females in the discipline of Individual Trampoline to compete at the 2020 Olympic Games as defined in the International Gymnastics Federation (FIG) document [Qualification System – Games of the XXXII Olympiad – Tokyo 2020 \(“FIG Qualification Document”\)](#) which can be found at: <https://www.gymnastics.sport/site/rules/rules.php#13>

Provided the U.S. earns its quota place(s) at the qualification events, USAG will fill all quota places. In addition, ~~one~~ up to two replacement athletes in each gender will be named.

1.3.2. Definitions:

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1.3.3. Process for selection:

Depending on the number of Federation quota place(s) earned by the U.S.:

- a. The male athlete and female athlete with the highest Combined Score will be named to the 2020 Olympic Team.
- b. The male athlete and female athlete with the second highest Combined Score will be named to the 2020 Olympic Team (if two Federation quota places are earned per gender), or the replacement athlete (if one Federation quota place is earned).
- c. The male athlete and female athlete with the next highest Combined Score will be the replacement athlete(s) to the 2020 Olympic Team (if two Federation quota places are earned per gender), or may be named as the second replacement athlete.
- d. Any quota place earned by name by an individual athlete will be filled by that athlete.

#### 1.4. Petition Procedures:

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#### 2.1. Provide rationale for utilizing discretionary selection (if any):

While Trampoline & Tumbling is a subjectively judged event, these procedures will primarily rely on objective criteria for selecting athletes to the 2020 Olympic Team through rankings and results at the Tryout Events listed in 1.2.1. However, there are two scenarios where discretionary selection criteria will be evaluated and those are through the petition process and in the unlikely case of a tie.

#### 2.2. List the discretionary criteria and explain how they will be used (if any):

##### 2.2.1. Discretionary criteria may be used in two (2) scenarios:

- Breaking a tie in Combined Score (defined in 1.3.2) during any of the steps outlined in 1.3.3.; and
- Reviewing and making a decision on any submitted petitions (refer to 1.4.).

##### 2.2.2. Criteria used by the Selection Committee (SC) will include:

- Total score potential: prior qualification total score or final pass score.

- Any physical, training or performance factor, which might inhibit peak performance at the 2020 Olympic Games.

In the event that a SC member is currently affiliated with any athlete or coach in consideration for a Team, or is unable to fulfill the obligations of the SC for any reason, a replacement will be named in the following order:

- Should the National ~~Head Trampoline Coach~~ Coordinator need to be replaced, the Junior National Trampoline ~~Coach~~ Coordinator will be named. ~~The National Head Coach will retain the right to present a selection recommendation (complete with reasoning), and~~



~~answer questions from the SC, after which time they will be required to leave the selection meeting.~~

- ~~Additional replacement member(s) named by the SC Chair, with preference given to:~~
- Should any other member of the SC need to be replaced (including the Junior National Trampoline ~~Coach~~ Coordinator) replacements will be named in the following order:
  - Elite Committee Chair
  - Chair of the Program Committee
  - Members of the SC for other T&T disciplines.
  - International experts (athlete / coach / judge with world-level competition or judging experience).
- Should the National Trampoline ~~Coach~~ Coordinator be replaced due to a conflict of interest, he or she will retain the right to present a selection recommendation (complete with reasoning), and answer questions from the SC, after which time they will be required to leave the selection meeting.

### 3. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

- 3.1. Prior to entry by name to the Local Organizing Committee by the USOPC, USA Gymnastics has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is to be nominated to the Team by USA Gymnastics may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Gymnastics:

- 3.1.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to USA Gymnastics President/CEO.
- 3.1.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Gymnastics. If an athlete refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Gymnastics, his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
- 3.1.3. Failure to participate in Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in Section 9 of these procedures.
- 3.1.4. Violation of USA Gymnastics Code of Ethical Conduct, National Team Agreement, or Trampoline & Tumbling Responsibility Manual, which may be found online at:

- 3.1.5. Inability to prove competition readiness (see Section 9 below).

An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per USA Gymnastics Bylaws, Article 10 and the USOPC's Bylaws, Section 9.

- 3.2. Once athlete entries have been submitted to the Local Organizing Committee by the USOPC, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team, at which time, in addition to

The report will be made public on the USA Gymnastics website. USA Gymnastics retains the sole discretion to determine the contents and timing of the report.**

USA Gymnastics will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents, including scouting or evaluation forms, etc., and data from the selection process for six (6) months past the date of the Closing Ceremony of the Games.

an in-person verification between USA Gymnastics Championships and July 1, ~~2021~~ 2020. These videos will be assessed by the National Trampoline Coach and an FIG Brevet judge. Failure to show complete routines (both compulsory and optional) may result in removal from the team (see 3.1.5.).
