Arizona State University men and James Madison University women capture National Championship title

The NAIGC (National Association of Intercollegiate Gymnastics Clubs) concluded their 26th annual National Championships on April 5, 2014, in Chattanooga, TN. Over 950 competitors, representing 75 clubs from across the country, participated in the competition.

Lee Wilkerson, a senior from Arizona State University won the all-around title with a score of 85.7. Another senior from Arizona State University, Stewart MacDonald, finished in second place (82.8). The third place finisher with a score of 82.4 was junior Tommy Trompeter from University of Texas at Dallas.

In the women's competition, senior Maria Hayden (James Madison University) dominated the competition, placing second on bars and first on beam, floor and all-around (38.075). Hayden's teammate, senior Morgan Byrd, scored 37.675 to place second in the all-around competition. Sophomore Courtney Muller from Kennesaw State University rounded out the podium with third place and a score of 37.25.

Arizona State University captured the first place men's team award with a score of 252.8. Winning the women's team competition was James Madison University with a score of 146.075.
